(Complaint of Smt. Anindita Saha against her husband).

03	17/05/2024	<p>Sri Dipak Saha, husband of the complainant Smt. Anindita Saha has submitted his written response along with copies of documents.</p> <p>The Registrar of Co-operative Societies has also under taken an inquiry through Joint Director of Co-operative Societies namely Sri Atanu Dewanjee and report submitted by Sri Dewanjee, dated 13/05/2024 has been forwarded by Sri S.Mog, Resgistrar of Co-operative Societies, Govt. of Tripura.</p> <p>The written response submitted by Sri Dipak Saha, husband of the complainant, shows that the marriage between the complainant Anindita Saha and Dipak Saha was solemnized in the year 2004 and they were blessed with a baby son namely Debarup, born in the year 2008. Sri Saha in his written response has made numerous allegations against his wife Anindita Saha including that of her illicit relationship with a paramour.</p> <p>The report submitted by the Registrar of Co-operative Societies in respect to the allegations made by the complainant cannot be resolved, since nothing is concluded in the report.</p> <p>We have meticulously examined the subject matter of the complaint, the written response of the Respondent, Sri Dipak Saha and the report submitted by the Registrar of Co-operative Societies, Govt. of Tripura.</p>	



Prima facie we find that Smt. Anindita Saha, the complainant is the legally married wife of Sri Dipak Saha. They have a son namely Debarup Saha, born to them in the year 2008. Sufficient materials are placed on record that Debarup is suffering from cancer and is under treatment at Tata Medical Care Hospital, Kolkata. Neither Anindita Saha nor Debarup has got any income to maintain their livelihood and cost of treatment. Whatever may be the allegation and counter allegation between the husband and wife, the right to life of the woman and the cancer patient son of them is of utmost importance. Since we cannot come to a conclusion at this stage on the basis of the materials which are before us at this stage, we direct our investigation wing to undertake a detailed inquiry into the allegation about the violation of human rights of the complainant and her son and to submit a report to the Commission within 6(six) weeks.


We further consider it appropriate to direct payment of interim compensation of Rs. 2,00,000/- (two lakhs) to the complainant by the Respondent Sri Dipak Saha, husband of the complainant within 15(fifteen) days from the date of receipt of copy of this recommendation as an interim relief for the livelihood and treatment of the minor boy. The Registrar of Co-operative Societies should ensure payment of the amount from the salary/payables of Dipak Saha to the complainant Anindita Saha. Smt. Anindita Saha shall maintain accounts of the amount spent for livelihood as well as the treatment of the minor boy and submit the accounts with supporting documents before the Commission on monthly basis.
