01	14/08/2025	<p>Attention of this Commission is drawn to a news item published in Pratibadi Kalam dated 14th August 2025 under the heading “১০০ এর মধ্যে ১৪ পেয়ে গেজেটেড অফিসার”, Similar news item is also published in different news papers of the state showing the detailed mark chart (result sheet) of the qualified Medical Officers.</p> <p>As per news item, total 216 medical officers were recommended by the Tripura Public Service Commission as qualified candidates in the post of General Duty Medical Officer and that was announced as per notification made in the month of July. 2024. They will join under the Health & Family Welfare Department, Govt. of Tripura. The news item shows that amongst those 216 nos. of qualified General Duty Medical Officers a good number of Medical Officers were selected when they got only 14 out of 100, 19 out of 100, 20 out of 100, 21 out of 100 so on i.e bellow 30.</p> <p>As per the news item, the quality of Tripura Medical Officers are compromised by the Tripura Public Service Commission and as such the health of the people of Tripura will be at stake.</p> <p>Right to appropriate health care of citizens comes under the purview of fundamental rights as enshrined under Article 21 of the Constitution of India. If Tripura Public Service Commission recommends the names of candidates who secured less than 30 out of 100, which means the</p>	

Commission is playing with the life of the citizens of the state which is not expected from a benevolent organization like TPSC.

In view of this, this Commission is worried about the future prospect of the health services which the state obligate bound to provide better health services towards its people.

The Commission thinks it appropriate to take cognizance of the matter and to obtain a report from the Director of Health Services, Govt. of Tripura and also from the Secretary, Tripura Public Service Commission.

Accordingly, issue notice to them to submit their report within 10(ten) days from the date of receipt of this order.

Copy of this order along with paper cutting may also be sent for their ready reference.

Considering larger public interest in Tripura, this Commission thinks it appropriate to recommend that appointment of those medical officers who secured 30 or less than 30 shall be kept in abeyance until further order.

List the matter after 10(ten) days.

Fix it on **26.08.2025** for report of the Director of Health & Family Welfare Department, and for report of the Secretary, TPSC.
